ADVICE FOR ATTENDING SERVICES

- Our waiting rooms are closed and we ask that mourners stay in their cars or wait outside until the time of the service.
- Follow the guidance on hand hygiene and preventing the spread of infection:
 - 1. wash your hands more often than usual, for 20 seconds using soap and water or hand sanitiser, particularly after coughing, sneezing and blowing your nose, or after being in public areas. Handwashing facilities are available on site in our public toilets.
 - 2. when you cough or sneeze, cover your mouth and nose with a tissue, or the crook of your sleeved arm (not your hands) if you don't have a tissue, and throw the tissue away immediately. Then wash your hands or use hand sanitiser.
- The Government guidance is that face coverings are expected and recommended in crowded areas. As the chapels are an enclosed indoor space with limited ventilation and fresh air, and may be crowded with people from multiple households, mourners attending services should continue to wear face coverings when gathered in the chapel.
- It is important to consider that others may wish to take a more cautious approach
 as we open up without most restrictions. We should all be considerate of this, and
 provide the opportunity and space for others to reduce close contacts if they wish.
- Please remember everybody needs to continue to act carefully and remain cautious to keep yourself and others safe.

After The Service

 To minimise overlap between different groups or people attending services and to reduce the risk of catching or spreading COVID -19 (please remember it is still possible to catch and spread COVID-19, even if you are fully vaccinated) we ask that mourners please leave the site immediately following the end of the service.
